

**Dane Courtney** is the Rector of Holy Trinity Launceston and Archdeacon for the northern part of Tasmania. He grew up in Sydney, attending Trinity Grammar School and then the University of Sydney, where he trained as a teacher (Mathematics). He taught briefly, and then worked for the Crusader Union before studying for ordained ministry. He served in the Diocese of Sydney in the parishes of St Ives, South Carlton, Quakers Hill, and Strathfield, before moving to Tasmania in May 2017 to take up his present role.

Dane and his wife, Bronwen, have three adult children and two grandchildren. His other interests include computers, music, golf, sailboards and Rugby.

Dane has been a member of the General Synod since 2001, and is a member of the Diocesan Council in the Diocese of Tasmania. He is a Board member of Launceston Church Grammar School, having previously served on the Council of Trinity Grammar School for 23 years, and was chairman of the Council of Rouse Hill Anglican College from its commencement in 2002 until the end of 2007. He is a Board member of the Anglican Church's publishing arm, Broughton Publishing.
