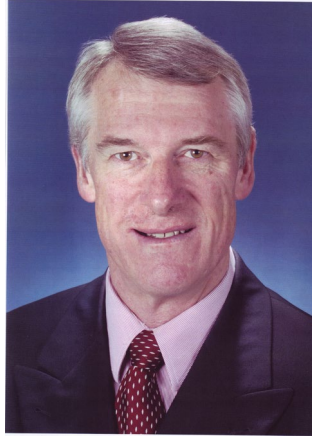


## GRANT CHAPMAN



Grant Chapman, aged 73, is married to Sally, has a married son, three young grandsons and a single daughter.

He has worshipped at St Matthew's Anglican Church, Kensington, S.A., since 1981 and served on its Parish Council in the mid-1980s. He served on Grace Anglican Network Council from 2017 until the Network's dissolution in January 2022 and continues on St Matthew's Parish Council. He has been St Matthew's Peoples' Warden and Select Vestry Member since 2020 and chaired the Rector Selection Committee, 2020-2021. He has served on Adelaide Diocese Synod since 2016 and the Board of Anglicare SA, 2015 to 2022. He is President of Christian Faith and Freedom, which advocates on behalf of persecuted Christians around the world.

Grant won the marginal Federal House of Representatives electorate of Kingston three times for the Liberal Party, 1975 to 1983. Prior to 1975, he was a marketing executive with Shell Co of Australia Limited and from 1983 to 1987, a self-employed management consultant.

From 1987 to 2008 he was a Liberal Senator for South Australia and Chaired the Joint Parliamentary Statutory Committee on Corporations and Financial Services, 1996 to 2007. He was Honorary Secretary of the Federal Parliamentary Christian Fellowship for a number of years.

Since 2008 he has undertaken periodic business consulting assignments, served as a Director of several small business start-ups, overseen family farming property and since 2018, been a Part-time Senior Member of the Commonwealth Government Administrative Appeals Tribunal.

He is President of the Kensington District Cricket Club and was President of the Liberal Party (SA Division) and a member of its Federal Executive, 2010 to 2013.

He holds an Honours Bachelor of Arts degree from the University of Adelaide, an Entrepreneurship Certificate from the former S.A. Institute of Technology (now University of S.A.), is a Graduate of the Australian Institute of Company Directors and a Knight of the Order of St John of Jerusalem, Hospitallers.
