Seak-King is currently on the boards of Anglican Overseas Aid (Anglicord), ISCAST and the Charity Law Association of Australia & New Zealand. She chairs the Charities and Not-for-profits Committee of the Law Council of Australia. She is also a warden at her church, St Jude's Carlton, in inner-city Melbourne.
